

Space/Time Parallels

In both cases there is something in nature that underlies and explains, but does not make sense of, our way of experiencing the matter.

Spatiality	Temporality
There is no <i>here</i> in nature	There is no <i>now</i> in nature
The pragmatic here depends on our projects.	The pragmatic now depends on our projects.
We understand things as close / or distant based on their accessibility.	We understand task duration by the way things yield or are denied to our concern. Soon or not until later.
We measure space by our own foot or a yardstick.	We measure time by using our shadow (the sun) or clock
We use inches, and feet to measure distance.	We use seconds to measure time.
If we remove accessibility, close and distant become near and far.	If we remove availability, we lose earlier and later and all that remains is before and after.
With deworlding we get pure 3-dimensional, nature space (res extensa) with no here, that <i>explains</i> causally limits on accessibility but can't make near and far intelligible.	With deworlding we get the time-free movements of nature with no now, that explains world-time but can't make earlier and later intelligible.
